



We Believe Alliance (WBA) World Record Recognition Program

Goal:

To help all students thrive in today's rapidly changing world, communities must close the disparity and achievement gaps between students. A united community is better positioned with resources and focus to close these gaps. To unite a community often takes an extraordinary effort that achieves unprecedented results. Therefore, to recognize a community's outstanding unprecedented results, the WBA establishes the following world record recognition program.

World Record Program Guidelines:

1. The WBA will establish world record categories for students, i.e. food drive collection, hours of community service, fund-raising, recycling, t-shirt and/or used jeans collections.
2. A student organization must apply in writing to the WBA in advance of its world record attempt.
3. The WBA will review the application and inform the applicant if it is eligible to compete for recognition.
4. The results of the world record attempt must be certified by the Mayor of the city and leader of the agency serving the category in which the record attempt is made. In the case of a food drive record, the record must be co-certified by the Director of the Food Shelf that is to receive the collected food.
5. The WBA will provide a world record certificate to the Mayor, who in turn, will present the certificate to the students.
